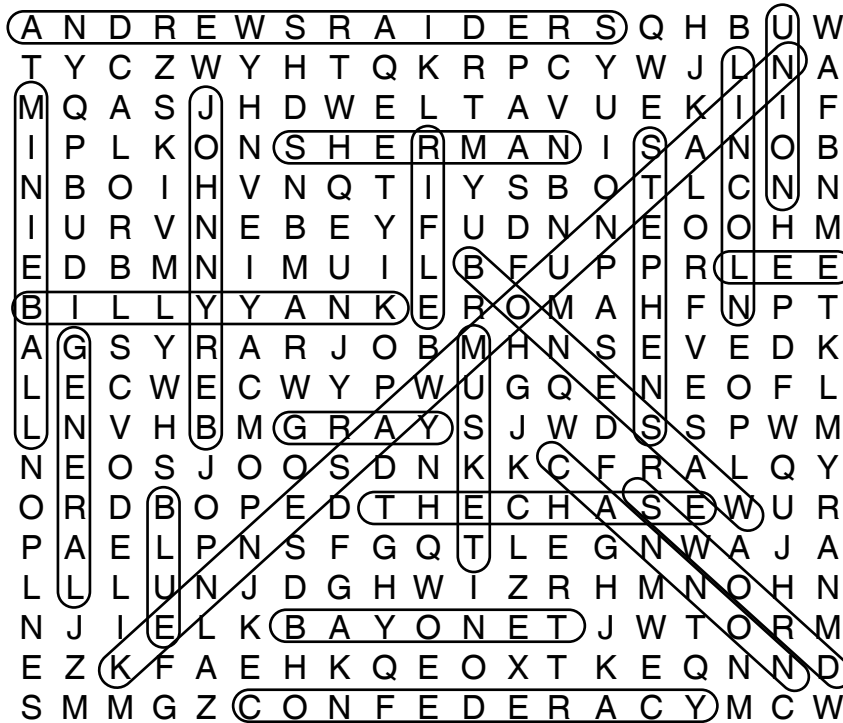

### ***Marietta's History: A Review***

The early inhabitants of the area that is now Marietta were the CHEROKEES or CREEKS and the CHEROKEES or CREEKS. These early inhabitants were forced to leave after GOLD was found in the North Georgia mountains.

Marietta was founded in 1833 and became an important stop for the RAILROADS. During the CIVIL WAR, the Union Army, under the direction of GENERAL SHERMAN burned down many of the buildings in Marietta. One of the buildings that survived was the KENNESAW HOUSE, where the Marietta Museum of History is located today.

After the war, Marietta became a popular resort town, and began to grow. The Marietta School System was founded, and ALICE MCLELLAN BIRNEY founded the national Parent Teacher's Association.

During World War II, the BELL BOMBER FACTORY opened in 1943 and manufactured over 600 B-29s. The plant closed after the war, and five years later it was purchased and became the LOCKHEED/MARTIN plant.

Today MARIETTA is the largest city in Cobb County, and is probably most famous for the BIG CHICKEN.
