

Marietta's History: A Review

The early inhabitants of the area that is now Marietta were the <u>CHEROKEES or CREEKS</u> and the <u>CHEROKEES or CREEKS</u>. These early inhabitants were forced to leave after <u>GOLD</u> was found in the North Georgia mountains.

Marietta was founded in <u>1833</u> and became an important stop for the <u>RAILROADS</u>. During the <u>CIVIL WAR</u>, the Union Army, under the direction of <u>GENERAL SHERMAN</u> burned down many of the buildings in Marietta. One of the buildings that survived was the <u>KENNESAW HOUSE</u>, where the Marietta Museum of History is located today.

After the war, Marietta became a popular resort town, and began to grow. The Marietta School System was founded, and <u>ALICE MCLELLAN BIRNEY</u> founded the national Parent Teacher's Association.

During World War II, the <u>BELL BOMBER FACTORY</u> opened in <u>1943</u> and manufactured over 600 <u>B-29s</u>. The plant closed after the war, and five years later it was purchased and became the <u>LOCKHEED/MARTIN</u> plant.

Today <u>MARIETTA</u> is the largest city in Cobb County, and is probably most famous for the <u>BIG CHICKEN</u>.
